

Purpose of the Fair Trade Committee


Administer the Fair Trade Fund with transparency and inclusivity.

Democratic Principles of Governance

• Inclusivity	All stakeholder groups have equal opportunities to participate.
 Transparency 	Decisions and resource management are openly communicated.
 Equal Representation 	Balanced perspectives ensure no group dominates decision-making.
 Accountability 	Members are responsible for their roles and actions.
 Collective Decision-Making 	Decisions are made through consensus or majority voting.

 - 3,500 nuts/day (up from 2,000).

- Won a solar system through Serendipol's Purpose
 & Values competition.
